#### Cyclone Recovery Update

The premiers grant closed on 30 June 2021 – to date throughout the Midwest: 900 applications have been received and over 700 have been processed with over \$2.4 million of approved payments. Other grants are still open but the Shire encourages everyone to get their applications in sooner rather than later as support services and budgets are being regularly reviewed. The advertising period for the DFES Community Recovery Officers to support cyclone recovery has closed with the department looking to onboard these roles soon.

The Shire CEO in the role of Local Recovery Coordinator for the district will be establishing a Local Recovery Coordination/Advisory Group to provide inputs that can be incorporated into strategic decision making and recovery actions specifically from the perspective of the Shire's built, natural, social and economic environments. If members of the community believe they have strategic level inputs to provide to the recovery process then please inform the Shire (ea@morawa.wa.gov.au) so your membership of the group can be considered. It is widely acknowledged that emergency recovery can be a 18-24 month process and the establishment of this group will ensure the Local Recovery Coordinator and Community Recovery Officers receive broad input into the recovery process and are kept informed on key issues affecting our community.


# Youth Centre Update Open Friday 23 July
