Council News

COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS 20 OCTOBER 2022

Adoption of Strategic Resource Plan 2022-2037

Council adopted the Shire of Morawa Strategic Resource Plan 2022-2037 incorporating asset management and long term financial planning.

Request from Main Roads Western Australia to assess the suitability of Nanekine Road, Indar Road and Heitman Road to modify the Restricted Access Vehicle Network (RAV) rating

Council has requested the CEO to work with Main Roads (MRWA) to conduct a route assessment and road safety audit on all requested roads (Nanekine, Indar, and Heitman) in relation to their RAV 7 suitability.

At this stage pre-formal MRWA assessment Council::

- Support Nanekine Road from Mullewa-Wubin Road SLK 3.61 to Thomas Road SLK 21.83 being classified as a conditional "Type A" Low Volume RAV 7.1 road.
- Does not support Indar Road from Nanekine Road SLK 0.00 to Gutha West Road SLK 14.87 to be classed as conditional "Type A" Low Volume RAV 7.1 road due to current safety concerns associated with the condition and geometry of the road.
- Does not support Heitman Road from Wilton Road/Nanekine Road SLK 0.00 to Sts Road SLK 7.84 to be classed as a conditional "Type A" Low Volume RAV 7.1 road due to current safety concerns around geometry, intersections, and sight lines.

The findings of the MRWA assessment will be reported back to Council. It is worth noting that Council have also requested that work commence on a 10 year road upgrade plan to try and better understand key freight routes that need to be on the RAV 7 network and the road engineering concerns that need to be overcome to safely transition the road network.

Proposed Future Footpath Network - 2 Year Plan

Council supported the administration submitting a grant application to complete footpath works on Granville Street and Broad Avenue/Gill Street over the next two financial years. Council also directed the CEO to redevelop the 10 year footpath plan to allow the Shire to continue to apply for footpath upgrade and development grants over the coming years.

All dogs over 3 months of age must be registered, wear a registration tag and a disc showing the owners name and address. All dogs must be microchipped.

Dog registration fees	1 year	3 years	Lifetime
Unsterilised	\$50	\$120	\$250
Sterilised	\$20	\$42.50	\$100

All cats must be sterilized and microchipped before registration.

Cat Registration Fees	1 Year	3 Years	Lifetime
Sterilised and Microchipped	\$20	\$42.50	\$100

Proof of sterilisation is required at the time of registration. Applicants (pet owners) must be over 18 years of age. Reduced registration rates (50%) are available for Pensioner Concession Card Holders

Prohibited Burning

15 October 2022- 28 February 2022.

Comply with the Code of Practice for Timber Plantations in the Western Australia Guideline for Plantation Fire Protection.
