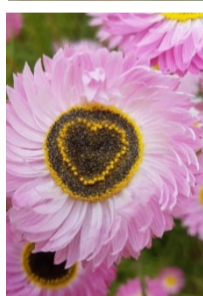
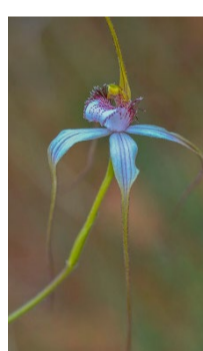


History

Although sheep and cattle had been run on pastoral leases from the late 1800's, clearing of the land and the growing of crops did not take place until the first farming families arrives in 1910.

(Morawa celebrated its 100th Birthday in 2010).

The economy of the District was almost entirely dependent on Agriculture and land was thrown open for farming through various government scheme that included soldiers from the First and Second World Wars.



Stargazing

Morawa is an AstroTourism Town and boasts some amazing dark night skies all year round! There is a dedicated viewing site at the Morawa Caravan Park where we welcome you to use your telescopes and binoculars to enjoy an evening of stargazing. Wildflowers

Undoubtedly the most popular time to visit Morawa and its surrounding region is during the wildflower season, from late winter through to early October. At this time of year caravans and campers come from far and wide to see the landscape at its most spectacular and to experience our mild winter climate. Not far beyond the town boundary, you can take in carpets of pink, yellow or white everlasting wildflowers, wreath flowers, and many species of Orchids. Roam throughout our Shire at any of our numerous reserves and you could come across many species of wildflowers unique to this district.
