Tribute to Mrs Noelene Carslake

I would like to on behalf of the Shire of Morawa, honour and recognize the profound and outstanding contribution of Mrs Noelene Carslake following her recent passing.

Mrs Carslake made history in Morawa, becoming the first female Councillor elected to the Shire in 1983, representing the Gutha North Ward until 1992. Her dedication, vision, and leadership were further cemented when she became the Shire's first female President, serving from 1990 to 1992.

Mrs Carslake was instrumental in driving the construction of the Morawa Sporting Complex. She also successfully negotiated with then Premier Carmen Lawrence to secure an increase in the minimum price per tonne of wheat, an action that helped strengthen the future of Morawa's agricultural industry.

A passionate advocate for education, Mrs Carslake championed opportunities for youth people in the region. Her determination helped secure grant funding for the construction of the Morawa College of Agricultural hostel, championing opportunities for young people across the region.

Mrs Carslake's love for Morawa and its people was lifelong. Having raised her family here and dedicating over 50 years as a teacher, her commitment, leadership, and care continue to inspire us today. Her deep love for Morawa and its people was evident in everything she accomplished.

The Shire of Morawa extends its deepest condolences to the Carslake family. Her legacy as a respected community leader and dedicated educator will be fondly and forever remembered.

Local Government 2025 Election: Shire of Morawa Councillors Sworn In

Three re-elected Councillors were officially sworn in Monday, 20 October 2025, ready to serve the community for the next four years.

Following the ceremony, Councillor Karen Chappel was re-elected by fellow Councillors to serve as the President, alongside Councillor Ken Stokes, re-elected to serve as the Deputy President.

Councillors Karen Chappel, Ken Stokes, and Mark Croaker, were returned by voters and will serve four-year terms ending in October 2029.

Following the retirement of Cr Deb Collins, the Shire of Morawa will be holding an extraordinary election in 2026 to fill the remaining vacant seat on Council.



Road Works and General Works

Our road crew has been actively engaged in maintenance grading as we prepare for the harvest season following a wet winter.

The resheeting of Collins Road is scheduled for completion by the end of October 2025. Culvert repairs on Krummel Road have been completed.

Additionally, we have been busy preparing the site for the new tennis courts. Asphalt has been laid, and once the fencing is installed, contractors will proceed with laying the new courts.

Parks and Gardens

Our Parks and Gardens team has been actively preparing firebreaks throughout the town site, alongside performing routine maintenance on all Shire green spaces. We have focused on maintaining the reticulation system, particularly by repairing a damaged pipe at the Winfield Street Town Centre.

Additionally, we have supported the newly established Morawa Community Garden by assisting in the setup of their infrastructure and donating supplies, preparing the soil for planting.






New Staff Members

Snake Safety

The Shire of Morawa is encouraging both residents and visitors to be cautious and mindful of snakes as the weather begins to warm up. It's essential to understand that snakes naturally inhabit our local bushland, so be mindful and remain vigilant while bushwalking or exploring for wildflowers

Remember if you come across a snake to move away slowly, Do not approach or provoke the snake and Ensure your pets are safe and cannot access the snake.

Be Aware of your Surroundings

Take care in bush land and grassy areas and always walk and/or cycle in cleared areas and designated paths only. Always keep a watchful eye on the ground about a metre ahead of where you are walking, and avoid entering areas with long grass, rushes and undergrowth.



Wear Appropriate Clothing

When bushwalking, wear long pants and boots or other enclosed footwear that preferably cover the ankles.



Around your home remove long grass and items lying on the ground such as corrugated iron, which may provide cover for snakes and be aware that chicken pens can attract snakes to your yard.



Educate Yourself on Snake Bite First Aid

Learn the correct First Aid treatment for a snake bite and keep up to date with first aid training. More information regarding Snake bite first aid can be found on the St John WA Website via the below QR code.
