## Thomson Geer COVID-19 Directives Guide (as at 9am AEST, 2 April 2020)

The COVID19 crisis has resulted in numerous government directives with the objective of implementing public health measures intended to reduce the spread of COVID19 and 'flatten the curve'. The table below sets out these directives and the relevant legislation providing the power to do so. These directives are changing daily and new directives are being issued regularly, please check for updates and contact us if you need specific advice.

Commonwealth/State/Territory	Status
Commonwealth (Biosecurity Act 2015 (Cth))	The Governor-General <u>declared</u> a human biosecurity emergency on 18 March 2020. The declaration is in force for 3 months and gives the Minister for Health expansive powers to issue <i>directions</i> and set <i>requirements</i> in order to combat the outbreak. This is the first time these powers under the <i>Biosecurity Act</i> have been used.
